About USDA FNS

The Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) agency of the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) is tasked with ending hunger and obesity in America. The agency administers 15 different federal nutrition assistance programs, some of which are highlighted over the next few pages. By their own estimates, FNS serves **1 in 4 Americans** over the course of a year.

SFMNP

Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program

*also known as **Farmers Market Checks***

The Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program provides coupons for fresh produce to people aged 60 or over and have an income at or below 185% of the poverty line. CACFP

Child and Adult Care Food Program

From the Child Care Resource Network: “The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) is a federal program that reimburses child care providers for providing healthy meals and snacks to children in child care.”

Child and adult care providers who are registered or licensed, or are in the process of becoming registered or licensed, are eligible for reimbursement for providing meals and snacks. Such organizations include: child care centers, family day care homes, community-based adult day care centers, after school programs in low-income areas, and homeless shelters providing meals to children.

Nutrition training, as well as recipes and an online record-keeping program, are included in the program. Children and adults, in return, develop healthy eating habits and receive nutritious meals meeting USDA nutrition guidelines in a safe, healthy environment.

NSLP

National School Lunch Program

From FNS: “The National School Lunch Program is a federally assisted meal program operating in public and nonprofit private schools and residential day cares. It provides nutritionally balanced, low-cost or free lunches to children each school day.”

Children receive **free lunch** if their families **receive SNAP** or are at or below **130% of the poverty line**.

Children receive **reduced price lunch** if their families **receive WIC** or are at or below **185% of the poverty line**.

Applications for free or reduced-priced meals are sent out prior to the start of every school year to qualifying households. Households that receive SNAP are automatically enrolled. Contact your school district for more details on pricing and menus.

Note: **All** Buffalo Public School students receive **free** lunch due to the Community Eligibility Provision.

SBP

School Breakfast Program

The School Breakfast Program works much like the National School Lunch Program, but is focused more on elementary schools and schools with “severe need.” Free and reduced-price thresholds are the same as the National School Lunch Program, but prices vary by school district, and not every district offers breakfast to all grade levels. Contact your school district for more details on pricing and availability.

Please note: **All** Buffalo Public School students receive Breakfast in the Classroom **at no charge**.

SFSP

Summer Food Service Program

From FNS: “The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) ensures that low-income children continue to receive nutritious meals when school is not in session.” According to Hunger Solutions NY, the SFSP is underutilized in New York, as **only 1 in 4 children** under 18 who qualify for free or reduced-priced meals during the school year **continue to receive meals during summer**.

Meal sites vary and could be any safe place where anyone under the age of 18 congregate when school is out, often in areas where 50% or more of the children receive free or reduced-price meals. No proof of income is required.

SNAP

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program

(formerly the Food Stamp Program)

According to the NY.gov website: “The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) issues electronic benefits that can be used like cash to purchase food.”

Benefits are issued monthly on the NYS Benefit Card, able to purchase **most** foods at authorized retail food stores. *Foods that are hot and ready to eat, such as rotisserie chickens, are not covered under SNAP.* In addition, benefits cannot be used to purchase non-food items, such as toiletries or vitamins.

Individuals or families at or below 130% of the poverty line are eligible for SNAP benefits. The eligibility cap rises to 200% of the poverty line if aged 60 or older, disabled, or paying for childcare.

Benefit amounts range from \$15 to \$194 per individual per month.

For those with an inclination to grow their own food, SNAP benefits *may* be used to purchase seeds and seedlings of food-producing plants.

WIC

Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for **Women, Infants, and Children**

According to the New York State Department of Health: “The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC) offers nutrition education, breastfeeding support, referrals and a variety of nutritious foods to low-income pregnant, breastfeeding or postpartum women, infants and children up to age five to promote and support good health.”

In New York State, WIC recipients receive vouchers to cover the cost of dairy products, eggs, fruits and vegetables, 100% juice, whole grain foods, formula, baby food, and other eligible items. The vouchers can **only** be used for eligible items.

Those who are pregnant or breastfeeding, as well as legal guardians of infants and children up to age 5, may be eligible to receive benefits. Eligible recipients automatically qualify if they already receive Medicaid, SNAP, or TANF.

Otherwise, they qualify if at or below 185% of the poverty level.

Eligible recipients **MUST** be residents of New York state, but **DO NOT** need to be U.S. citizens.

Families are also eligible if they have children who qualify for – or already receive – free and reduced-priced lunches or are in the Head Start program. Classes are provided at no charge. 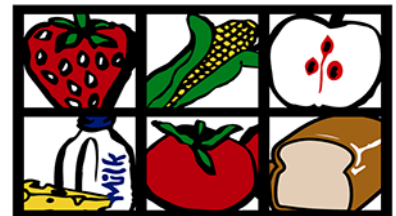

EBT Farmers Market Token Program

While some individual vendors *may* accept EBT cards at any farmers market, three Erie County markets accept SNAP benefits throughout the entire market:

Clinton-Bailey Farmers Market

At these markets, SNAP recipients bring their EBT card to the market office or information booth, and deduct a certain amount of their choosing. In exchange, they receive tokens equivalent to the amount withdrawn, which can then be used like cash for SNAP-eligible foods throughout the market. Tokens are **market-specific**, but *do not need* to be used right away. The token program also works in tandem with:

Double Up Food Bucks!

From **July** through **October**, any *even* dollar amount – up to \$20 – from SNAP benefits will be **doubled**. For example, if a SNAP recipient deducts \$4, they will receive \$8 in tokens to be used at these markets:
